Plans are underway to consider a new capital campaign for Indiana Eta – with the hopes of a new house in 2017.

Adam Wood - 0576 came to Indiana Tech to pursue a degree in computer networking. Due to a feeling of obligation to country and family, Adam left Indiana Tech his sophomore year to join the Air Force. Adam attended Indiana Tech from August 2007 - January 2009. He was stationed at Eglin Air

Force Base in Fort Walton Beach, FL.

Adam went into Explosive Ordinance Disposal (EOD), one of the more stressful and demanding jobs requiring a significant amount of training, including getting certified in all manners of hazardous goods. Adam is now a safety expert and has been deployed to Oman and Afghanistan. He was awarded an Afghan Campaign Medal and received an Army Commendation for services. Impressively, Adam was awarded Airman of the Year in all four groups he was a part of.

Recently, Adam was promoted to Staff Sergeant (E3) and is interested in getting an IT job with the government after his enlistment ends. He is still working towards his bachelor's degree and is working on his IT certifications.



Lessons from the Frank J. Ruck Leadership Institute Told by: Jordan Cunningham - 0633

"Never will you experience better times, than those with your brothers" is a phrase that resonates within the minds of every SigEp, producing the fondest of memories and emotions. While spending time amongst the true leaders and innovators of my generation in Richmond, Virginia at the Frank J. Ruck Leadership Institute, there was no exception to that statement. The Frank J. Ruck Leadership Institute is an intensive five-day event for SigEp's top rising leaders. The program focuses on personal leadership skills

and the Balanced Man Ideal. SigEp alumni serve as mentors and guide Ruck scholars through competitive challenges and lessons in leadership.

Despite regional differences, there was zero hindrance on interactions among brothers. This is something I have never experienced outside of SigEp and it never amazed me as much as it did while at Ruck.

These gentlemen continued to amaze me throughout the entire Ruck experience. The most impressive display provided from these brothers was on the frisbee field. In all my years of being a part of athletic groups, teams and intramurals, I have never seen true athleticism as shown to me by the entirety of the Ruck participants. I saw men sliding for catches, catching Frisbees while double and triple guarded and making throws that I couldn't muster if you paid me. Even though the turf hurt, it was beyond hot and our bodies ached, an example of Sound Body has never been more epitomized than by Yellow Group, and the teams we so graciously allowed to defeat us.

Another phenomenal impression was made by our facilitators, Adam Seiber and Brad Nahrstadt. These men exemplified what it meant to lead the next generation while not letting any "older generation hubris" fog their teachings and opinions. Adam and Brian provided attitudes, viewpoints and ideals within the Ruck leadership criteria that made it a much more SigEp experience as opposed to a generic leadership workshop. Beyond that, they knew what it was to be humble. Should a Ruck participant have a different viewpoint, it was respected.

My final signature experience from Ruck came from Past Grand President Steve Shanklin's "Living the Ritual." Brother Shanklin provided a beautiful explanation of how the ritual does not magically change a person into the SigEp man we all aspire to become. In fact, it is everything outside of the ritual that represents whether or not we epitomize Virtue, Diligence and Brotherly Love.

The connections made at the Ruck Leadership Institute will certainly stick with us for a lifetime, regardless of whether or not we see one another again. While we all said our goodbyes, the claim "I just wish you all were in my chapter, we would have the absolute best chapter" was rampant. I could only disagree silently in my mind... because I already have a chapter that exceeds all of what these leaders wanted. I have Indiana Eta.
